Benefits of a Universal Medicare Program

- Provides insurance to all and leads to universal health care
- Has potential to improve efficiency and reduce cost

Concern – Lack of Trust in One Entity

Applies to both public and private systems

Concern - Choice

- Applies to Universal Medicare Program
 - Private insurance cannot duplicate services provided by Medicare
- Applies to Free Market
 - People want their choice to be easy, reliable, cost effective, and guaranteed in time of illness

Answer to the Quandary?

- Need public/private competition to incentivize each entity to be their best
- Create open, authentic dialogue

Concern – Coverage Over Cost

- Addressing cost of the system is secondary to expanding coverage
- Patients will see a significant reduction in cost but taxpayers will see a significant increase in cost.

Solution – Fix the System

Provide basic primary care, dental care, and mental health care free to EVERYONE

Hows

- Community Health Centers
 - Provides primary care, dental care, and mental health for less than \$1,000 per person per year
 - About 75% of the population requires only primary care so their needs will be fully met
 - People who don't want to go to a community health center can pay for primary care through direct primary care providers

Implementation

- Have well defined services
 - Preventive care
 - Care for acute minor illness
 - Reproductive care
 - Care for common chronic disease
- Provide care on an individual and community basis

Additional Benefits

- Can serve as treatment centers for addiction
- Can serve as centers of preparedness
 - Epidemics
 - Bioterrorist events

Innovative Operations

- Extended hours
- Individual and group care
- Community health workers
- Ample use of technology

Important Feature

No Billing!

Keys to Success

- Clearly defining the care that will be delivered
- Appropriate funding
- Creating a culture of good care and accountability
- Intense public education on what the centers provide

What Happens to Insurance?

- Returns to the true definition of insurance
- Remove primary care from insurance coverage
 - Reduces overhead
 - Reduces insurance cost

What is the Cost?

- We waste \$320 billion minimum in overhead
- 323 million people in this country at \$1,000/person/year
- Current cost of health care > \$10,000/person/year
 - Taxpayers pay half the bill \$5,000/person/year
