US Antitrust and Competition Policy Amid the New Merger Wave By John E. Kwoka for *Washington Center for Equitable Growth*, July 27, 2017

Over the past 20 years, major sectors of the US economy have undergone sweeping consolidation, from airlines to brewing, cable television to drug companies, eyeglasses to finance, and grocery stores to hospitals to industrial chemicals—nearly the entire alphabet of industries in the United States. In many cases, this consolidation has reduced the number

of significant competitors in these industries to only three or four, prompting concerns about diminished competition, higher prices, and a range of other harms to the US economy and society. Highlighting these concerns the Obama administration, last year, issued an unprecedented executive order that instructed agencies to ensure that competition plays a role in their policy actions. Backing up that executive order was an issue brief from the White House Council of Economic Advisers, or CEA, titled "Benefits of Competition and Indicators of Market Power"—a title whose significance was lost on no one.

Since World War II... neither preventing nor winning wars have been among America's strong suits. The nation has instead been embroiled in serial conflicts and interventions in which victories have been remarkably scarce, a trend that has only accelerated in the post-9/11 era. From Afghanistan to Iraq, Somalia to the Philippines, Libya to Yemen, military investments -- in lives and tax dollars -- have been costly and enduring victories essentially nonexistent.

Taxpayers for Common Sense

Taxpayers for Common Sense has created a comprehensive Cyber Spending database to show how much money the federal government is spending on cyber programs across all agencies - which, in addition to being complex and dynamic, are inherently at risk today, in the age of the hack.

It's especially important to ask where the taxpayer's money is going. Until now, there hasn't been an easy way to track this information. Furthermore, the fragmented nature of cyber security programs means there is no central authority for tracking amounts or efficiencies of spending. Unlike most other types of government spending -- except intelligence and, perhaps, homeland security - cyber spending isn't easily tracked or fully documented.

Book Review

Fossil Capital: The Rise of Steam Power and the Roots of Global Warming by Andreas Malm By The London School of Economics and Political Science, July 7, 2017

In this bold, original and provocative book, Andreas Malm offers a radical reinterpretation of the origins of the steam age as means to challenge conventional analyses of global warming. He aims to develop a Marxist account of climate change that emphasises the link between carbon-centric development and capitalist accumulation. He proffers the concept 'Capitalocene' to replace 'the Anthropocene' in a challenge to the idea that the build-up of carbon in the atmosphere is a long-term process reflecting a universal trait of the human species. The underlying claim is that capitalist social relations produced the steam age and global warming, and that they will prevent the emergence of the large-scale collective efforts essential to the successful application of renewable energy. Understanding the origins of the steam age, then, is crucial to understanding the way that socio-economic processes are welded to distinctive forms of energy use.

We Oppose Military Action with North Korea

Tensions between the US and North Korea are reaching new heights, and the possibility for military conflict is growing. The US continues to avoid direct dialogue with North Korea, instead favoring sanctions and a strong-arm approach to bring North Korea to the table. At the same time, North Korea continues to progress its nuclear and missile capabilities. One small misstep by either side could ignite, in the words of General Joseph Dunford, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, "a loss of life unlike any we have experienced in our lifetimes."
